BRIEF DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

July 30 - Arrivals and introductory evening program.

July 31 - San Xavier Mission, Continental and vicinity, Madera Canyon and vicinity, vicinity of Tumacocari National Monument, Rio Rico and vicinity, Kino Ponds and on to Sierra Vista.

August 1 - Ft. Huachuca (Garden, Scheelite, and Sawmill Canyons in the Huachuca Mountains).

August 2 - Sonoita Grasslands (Rain Valley Loop Road off highway 82), Patagonia area (Pattons' feeders, Roadside Rest and along edge of Nature Conservancy area), Patagonia Lake State Park, and Kino Ponds. Late afternoon/early evening program which included Phoebes, Kingbirds, and *Myiarchus*.

August 3 - Top of Carr Canyon, early afternoon program on *Contopus* and *Empidonax* and Beattys' feeders in Miller Canyon and Mary Jo's feeders in Ash Canyon.

August 4 - Top of Carr Canyon and return to Tucson, the workshop concluding at about noon at the Tucson airport.
